East- and Westbound I-10

- From 8 p.m. each night to 6 a.m. following morning, on Sunday, Sept. 13, and Monday, Sept. 14, the left lane (the median lane) is scheduled for closure from milepost 218 to milepost 219 for removal of the barrier wall. One lane will remain open at all times.

- From 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. the following morning, on Monday, Sept. 14, the eastbound exit ramp 219 (Picacho Peak Road) will be closed as workers set barrier wall.

Access to services during the closure:

Eastbound I-10 motorists accessing Picacho Peak Road (Dairy Queen, gas and retail services): **exit at 211A** (before Picacho Peak Road). At the stop sign, turn left and cross under the interstate. Follow the frontage road to Picacho Peak Road.
