ISSUE STATEMENTS

Issue 1: Calls for Service

A 100% increase in County population since 2000 and continued projected growth of 38% over the next five years could, if not addressed, result in:

- increased response time for all calls

- an increase in the crime rate
- less time for quality investigations
- less time for officers to spend on proactive policing in the community, schools, and crime prevention programs
- inadequately located facilities
- Decreased ability to maintain acceptable standards in training

COUNTY PRIORITY ALIGNED TO:

Public Safety:

Pinal County will foster safe neighborhoods and communities, as evidenced by:

By 2013, decrease law enforcement response time from 9.43 (as of December 2010) minutes to eight (8) minutes for Priority 1 emergency calls.

2-5 YEAR STRATEGIC GOALS:

By 2013, reduce average response time for:

Priority 1* calls for service from 9.43 (December 2010) minutes to eight (8) minutes.

*Priority 1 calls are emergency calls which may include threats to life or dangerous or serious injury or major property damage. This could also include any felony or violent misdemeanor where the suspect remains on the scene or may be apprehended in the vicinity.

By 2013, the Adult Detention Facility will have zero (0) suicides per year.

ANNUAL PERFORMANCE MEASURES:

1. By 2013, decrease law enforcement response time from 9.43 (as of December 2010) minutes to (8) minutes for Priority 1 emergency calls

2. Achieve zero (0) suicides in the Adult Detention Center
