Effective June 4th we implemented a new intake procedure so that in the majority of cases the patient receives a complete physical and mental health appraisal at intake. Between June 1 and June 30, 832 inmates were booked into the jail and 790 of them received an intake health appraisal. The new intake health appraisal replaced the 14-day health appraisal.

During this reporting period 123 patients were seen by psychiatric medical providers and their conditions were assessed. In 112 patients their condition remained stable or improved, in 11 cases their condition worsened. Mental Health conditions can worsen for a number of reasons including non-compliance with the prescribed treatment plan, co-occurring conditions, and extraordinary life events.

In June of 2014 there were 16 juveniles who arrived and stayed in the Justice Center for seven days or greater. Of those, all but one received an initial health appraisal upon arrival at the facility and 14 received a physical exam by a medical provider within seven days. We are evaluating our processes to ensure all juveniles receive both medical screenings within the proper time frames.

In June of 2014 there were 51 patients with 80 chronic conditions who had been in the facility for three months or greater requiring treatment and monitoring. There were two patients' conditions assessed as being in poor condition and two patients' statuses were not recorded at the last medical provider visit.
