Purpose

- Evaluate the current systems healthcare, transportation and security costs as they relate to inmates that have to receive medical care inside and outside of the facility.
- Identify enhancements that if implemented would result in overall cost savings (direct healthcare costs and security costs) increased quality and decreased liability

Purpose

- Prepare a report and recommendation for the Board of Supervisors on the best quality, lowest overall cost and lowest risk solution for delivery of correctional health services.



Process

- Create an request for proposal for correctional health services that meets the desired standards of quality, cost containment and risk reduction.
- Evaluate those proposals against the current and costs optimal operation.



Process

- Evaluate the services for the adult and juveniles separately due to the differing standards and needs.
- Select the strongest proposal for BOS recommendation, internal, external and if external which vendor.
